Phoenix Suns Acquire Power Forward Kevin Durant

Blockbuster Trade is Complete Hours Before Deadline

Phoenix, AZ. – Today, the Phoenix Suns agreed on a monumental trade deal with the Brooklyn Nets. The Phoenix Suns send Cameron Johnson, Mikal Bridges, four future first-round picks and a 2028 first-round pick swap to Brooklyn in return for two-time NBA Finals Champion Kevin Durant and former Phoenix Sun T.J. Warren.

“There’s no doubt that we will miss our guys, as they will always be a part of the Sun's family and have made a tremendous impact on the team and organization,” said Monty Williams, Head Coach, Phoenix Suns. “In terms of Durant, we are excited to welcome him to the family and ready to get him acclimated to our organization. His talent will be an asset to our team in more ways than one.”

Durant played the last two and a half seasons with the Brooklyn Nets. He started in 126 regular season games, averaging 28.3 points on 53.8% from the field and 90.9% from the free throw line with 7.1 rebounds in a total of 100.1 minutes. This 6-10, 240 pound Power Forward appeared in 16 postseason games and 84.4 minutes with the Nets.

A fourteen-year NBA veteran, Durant holds career averages of 27.3 points and 7.1 rebounds in 978 games. Of those 978 total career games, Durant has started in 975 of them. After just one season with the University of Texas, he began his career with the G League team Seattle Supersonics.
